A required component of the North Dakota Comprehensive Literacy Improvement through Measured Building Systems (CLIMBS) grant, the Educators' Network is an innovative way to elevate educators, accelerate collaboration, and provide sustained and job-embedded professional learning focused on literacy and the science of reading.

What You Will Do

Role-Alike Groups.

As a member, you will join a role-alike group with other North Dakota educators who teach similar grades.

Collaboration.

Each role-alike group will be supported by an Educators' Network facilitator, who will help members share resources, deepen their understanding of evidence-based literacy practices aligned with the science of reading, and collaborate to improve implementation of those practices.

Connections.

Role-alike groups will meet and have opportunities to learn from one another at least once a month.
